Saturday, September 10th - Pet Expo at the Forum parking lot by Treats Unleashed

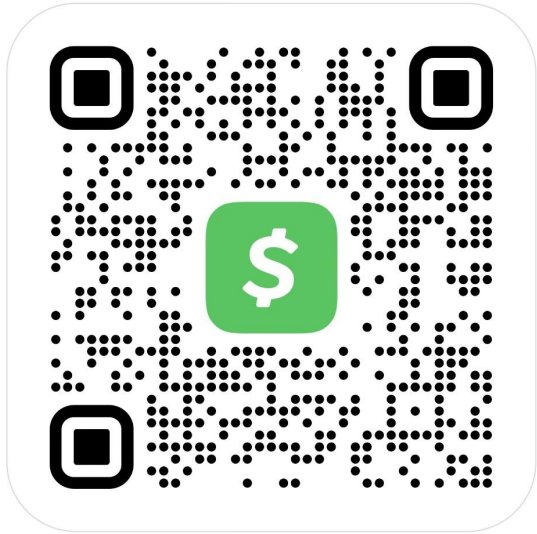
- Event is from 10am-2pm, however help is needed setting up at 8:30am

Seeking conscientious and hard-working individuals to apply for a technician assistant position in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) at the University of Missouri Veterinary Health Center. These individuals will be given the responsibility of caring for small animal patients alongside technicians, doctors, and third and fourth year veterinary students to ensure the best possible care for the admitted and emergency patients. Duties include performing hourly treatments and providing supportive care as well as restocking medical supplies and maintaining the cleanliness of the facility.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- ♦ Applicant must be an enrolled student at the University of Missouri.
- ♦ Applicant must be capable of lifting and carrying 50+ pounds.
- ♦ Applicant must be willing to work with fearful and aggressive animals.
- ♦ Animal handling and/or clinic experience preferred, but not required.
- ♦ Applicant must be eligible to work 2-3 of the following holidays and breaks, chosen randomly by raffle. If you draw a holiday, you are required to work that day. There are **NO** exceptions to this policy.

Evening on-call: 4:15pm- 11:30pm
